∩ Tree

Trees are a great food source for bees and sometimes they make a home in them.



Fallen leaf

A pile of fallen leaves can help bees in the winter by providing shelter and warmth.



Bee

Honeybees, bumblebees and other bees help pollinate 1/3 of the food we eat. They are awesome.



☐ Flower

Flowers provide food for bees, and bees help spread a flower's seed. They need each other.



Just like us, bees need a clean water source to survive. They even drink it with their tongue (or, proboscis).



Butterfly

Butterflies and bees can often be seen sharing a flower — they're both great pollinators.



Bee-pollinated food

Since bees pollinate 1/3 of our food (including many fruits, veggies and nuts), you've got lots of options here. Check the fridge!



A lawn with wildflowers and no pesticides is a bee-friendly lawn — and it's pretty to look at!



○ Bare dirt

Patches of dirt help ground-nesting bees find a home. Did you know 70% of native bee species create nests in the ground?



\supset Dandelion

These cheerful yellow flowers provide much-needed food for bees in early spring.
